Dear parents / carers,


I can't believe that a term has already gone. It has certainly been busy across the Federation and there is so much to be proud of!

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September 2023 School Transport Applications

All school leavers (Year 4 and Year 7) need to complete a new application if they require transport assistance to their new school in September.

This will be assessed under Worcestershire County Council's Home to School Transport Policy and applications should be made via the Council's

website: www.worcestershire.gov.uk/SchoolTransportApplication.

It is important that an application is made online as soon as possible, or at least before 31st July, to ensure that the request can be assessed and any pass issued in time for the start of the new academic year.

Late applications (submitted after 31st July) will still be accepted but MAY NOT be assessed in time for the start of the new academic year.
