

## ADVANCE NOTICE OF ROAD CLOSURES: FRIDAY 22 JULY 2022 PERSHORE

The Birmingham 2022 **Queen's Baton Relay (QBR)** will visit **PERSHORE** on **Friday 22 July 2022** as it makes its way to Birmingham for the Commonwealth Games. The QBR began at Buckingham Palace when Her Majesty The Queen placed her message to the Commonwealth into the Baton. This message will be read at the Opening Ceremony in Birmingham.

Whilst not guaranteed, the QBR is scheduled to arrive at 14:31 on Bridge Street. 4 Batonbearers will then take it turns to carry the Baton up the High Street and finish at the Cherry Orchard Junction at 14:41.

**Please note: The QBR could be up to 30 minutes early and up to 1 hour late of the times stated above.**

### Pershore Closures

For the safety of the people involved with the celebrations and lining the route, road closures (except emergency services) will be in place for all vehicular traffic.

- Bridge Street up to the Cherry Orchard Junction on the High Street will be **closed for a maximum 20 minutes between the times of 14:00 and 15:30.**
- **All roadside parking** will be suspended on the High Street from Broad Street to the Cherry Orchard Junction from **13.30 up to 15.30.** Parking on the B4084 Bridge Street will not be affected.
- **Expect Delays** on the B4084 by Pershore College and the Pensham Hill Junction. Traffic control measures will be in place to allow the QBR convoy to depart Pershore College and enter the road closure area.

**With the road closures in place, residents and businesses in the Pershore area, are advised to:**

- Plan your route, allow plenty of time to travel/park and where possible walk or cycle.
- Check your diaries for any scheduled deliveries and appointments due between 14:00 and 15:30.
- Pass on this letter/road closure plans onto anyone planning to visit you.
