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Cherry Blossom have been looking at 'Stone Age Boy' in English and have created a text map with matching actions to help remember a section of the story.









In Art, linking to our theme of the Stone Age, the children created their own cave paintings.

and there's been loads of collaboration and team-work














Year 7 - Eagle - Mr Summers






